On Easter Day, the disciples woke up in grief. Their friend and mentor, Jesus, was dead. By the time they took to their beds that night they were alive with bewildered joy - the tomb was empty, their Lord was alive!

So the tale goes. But can it be believed? This year, Easter Monday falls on April $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ - is the resurrection tale just a hoax, a cruel prank? Make no mistake, the answer to this

question is hugely significant. If Christ never rose from the dead, then many millions of Christians have wasted their lives or even laid down their lives in vain, defending a myth. The apostle Paul writes, "If Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith."

But what if a man who had been dead three days could really have returned to life? That would change everything. There could be nothing more important in life than finding out what happened to him, and what he wants of us.

The early Christians were obsessed with demonstrating the reality that a dead man rose. The world around them was not filled with gullible neanderthals. They knew just as well as you or I that dead people stay dead. The gospel writers spend a lot of time justifying their claims with a range of testimony. And ultimately, almost all of them died defending the truth of what they saw. People don't do that for a hoax.

The Christian gospel is unashamedly miraculous. It has to be, for it says that in a world where death is the last word on every natural process, the inevitable consequence for a world that has turned its back on God, there was a time when someone broke the rules. Someone who loved God, obeyed God, and in so doing, defeated death. That Someone invites everyone willing to believe in Him to come and share in that life too.

Christ is risen indeed! Happy Easter!

Alexi Navalny

I was struck recently by an account of the courage of Alexi Nalvany which appeared in the Diocesan Newsletter on 22 February. The article, written by **Stuart Bailey, LLM of Darby Green and Eversley Benefice,** recounts the Christian faith that motivated Navalny to take up his cause.

When he returned to Russia in 2021 he knew that he might be arrested and killed - he had already had one attempt on his life. During his trial he spoke bravely about his faith and its relation to his political activity: "The fact is that I am a Christian, which usually sets me up as an example for constant ridicule in the Anti-Corruption Foundation, because mostly our people are atheists. I was once quite a militant atheist myself. But now I am a believer, and that helps me a lot in my activities, because everything becomes much, much easier. I think about things less. There are fewer dilemmas in my life, because there is a book in which, in general, it is more or less clearly written what action to take in every situation. It's not always easy to follow this book, of course, but I am actually trying."

He then went on to quote the Beatitudes in Matthew's gospel: "'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied'. I've always thought that this particular commandment is more or less an instruction to activity."

Stuart comments: 'I hope these words will be an inspiration, an 'instruction to activity', to us all this Lent, that we might *take up* our cross to follow Christ, that we might make the most of every opportunity to spend time in God's presence and immerse ourselves in his Word, so that in the end we too might end up with fewer dilemmas in life.'

Bella's Story Some of you may already have seen this story on MAF's website. Bella, an

innocent little girl will grow up happy, healthy and free of judgment thanks to the partnership between CURE and MAF.

When her daughter Bella was born, Christine was in shock. She had never seen a child with a cleft lip and palate before and was unsure what was wrong. After failed attempts at an explanation, she began to blame herself for her daughter's condition.



In September 2023, this changed when Christine attended a CURE mobile clinic, flown into her remote village by MAF. The 3-hour flight saved over 10 hours of gruelling road travel.

After assessing Bella, and assuring Christine she is not alone, the doctors scheduled Bella for corrective surgery, along with 14 other children. Dr Federico shared, 'Every step we take to lift a child up is a step towards a world where differences are celebrated, and every heart is made whole again.' Bella's journey serves as a profound testament to the impact of collaborative efforts in transforming the lives of children.

Distressingly, people had told Christine that Bella looked like a pig. "I remember thinking maybe my child is like this because every time I saw a pig, I'd laugh at it!" Christine told us. Fortunately, Christine received news of an upcoming CURE mobile clinic near her home. She and Bella live very far from a CURE Hospital or any hospital.

Awareness is also created in the community so that families avoid hiding children with correctable disabilities but feel more confident to bring them to for professional treatment. Research shows that rural women are more vulnerable than any other population on earth. Often, the only way to reach them is by air.

- Pray for the Lord's protection over vulnerable women in these rural areas.
- Pray that the Lord will continue to use MAF to bring help, hope and healing to mothers and their children in isolated communities.
- Pray that MAF's partnership with organisations that support women and children will continue to grow.

Geography trip

Ober Water at Whitefield Moor, Brockenhurst



Team Upper Juniors brought their learning to life in geography recently when they visited Ober Water in Brockenhurst, a tributary of Lymington River.

We were supported by The Wessex Rivers Trust, who delivered an assembly in school prior to the trip. This helped the children learn about the features and wildlife in a river's upper, middle and lower course before they visited Ober Water.

Whilst at the river they were able to use their geographical skills to collect data, to allow them to measure and analyse their findings when back at school. We learnt to use flow velocity measurements, width and depth for a cross-section of the river classroom teachir When back in the classroom childre were able to com fieldwork sketche turn their data integrated findings with other classes and discovery how the weather our environment.

and finally, took part in a river dipping activity where we observed the different species living in the river.

Studying rivers in the field enabled our children to observe these processes firsthand, deepening their understanding beyond classroom teaching. When back in the classroom children were able to complete fieldwork sketches and turn their data into graphs, comparing their findings with other classes and discovering how the weather affects

The LORD is my Shepherd (Psalm 23:1) This month Kate Pryde looks at verse four of this psalm ...

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death

I will fear no evil, for you are with me; Your rod and your staff they comfort me.

Psalm 138:7 puts this a little differently ...

Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve my life.

If we remember the story of the good Samaritan, we will realise that travelling in Biblical times, and indeed even to the present day, is not always safe. There were areas of the countryside that were barren and lacking in water and other areas infested with robbers. It could be dangerous for the lone traveller. Perhaps if we are diagnosed with terminal illness there is the comfort of knowing that we can depend on the rod and staff of God to support us.

We are reminded of Isaiah 43:2

When you pass through the waters I will be with you And through the rivers they shall not overwhelm you.

The good Shepherd sees our needs and is there with us - 'even to the end of time'.

THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN ...

We went to the Hawk Conservancy Trust near Andover. What a treat we had! Through the day, we saw four displays from vultures, owls, storks, kites and finished with a 33 year old golden eagle.

The first display started with a vulture called a caracara, flying over a high fence to find the treats hidden under flower pots and coconut shells in the grass. His name was Sirius, and he is the joker of the vultures, pulling washing off a line especially if it was red in colour. As fast as the handler picked the red

trousers up, down they came again.

My favourite was the snowy owl called Sweeny Tod. He stands 27in (70cm) tall with a wing span of 50in (120cm), covered in white feathers with black markings. He lives in the Artic regions at -30°C, so only appears in the winter months.

Later, a lot of the birds flew together. They fly very low just skimming the audience's



heads, so we were warned to duck if necessary! I cannot explain what a thrill it was to see these large birds so close. Have you ever sat on a bench with a tawny owl sat beside you? I have!

All the birds have names and trust their handlers completely. Only the smaller birds were carried in to the displays, the rest just appeared. I think we went at the best time of the year, although it was cold. There were only about 80 people there making it easy to get close to the birds.

We often hear about Open the Book in Tiptoe ... but how about Open the Book in Kenya? The following is an extract from a Bible Society article, encouraging us to think outside our own neighbourhood ...

A Christian outreach for children with HIV/AIDS



Joy Children's Village was started 12 years ago by Nazareth Hospital, a Christian outreach just outside Nairobi. It cares for about 60 children with HIV/ AIDS, providing a family-based environment for girls and boys who might be ill or orphaned or abandoned by their parents.

Despite significant improvement, Kenya continues to experience an HIV epidemic. More than a hundred thousand Kenyan children have the virus, which can be transmitted mother to child when a woman who is HIV positive becomes pregnant.

The youth wing of the Kenya's Bible mission team has embraced Open the Book as a dynamic way to sow the seeds of spiritual change, inspiring a Bible-reading culture among young people.

The Open the Book programme

'Open the Book is so special to me,' said Anne (a leader in Open the Book in Kenya). 'It stands out as a child-friendly approach to Bible outreach.'

The children at Joy Village were introduced to stories of Tabitha being raised from death (from Acts 9) and of Jesus healing a man of blindness. And because Open the Book combines narration with dramatisation, the children were invited to join in performances of these stories.

Anne said, 'Open the Book makes it easy for children to remember Bible stories. This is the most unique and attractive children's programme we have, and it's something I missed when I was a child.'

A personal recommendation to any coping with the trials of Dementia

"SOMEONE I USED TO BE" by Wendy Mitchell

I, Margaret, first heard Wendy Mitchell talking about her book "Someone I used to be" just as we were coming to the end of a hard period in our family life. My parents and my parents-in-law all suffered from Alzheimer's disease and/or vascular dementia. Their illnesses overlapped but all four of them exhibited different symptoms.

Wendy Mitchell was diagnosed with young-onset dementia at the age of 58 and took a very proactive approach to dealing with her illness.

While each person's experience of the illness is different, Wendy's book is full of insights which can help family members, as well as people with the illness. For instance, she wrote about problems she faced when living in a noisy city. She had previously loved the noise and bustle but as her illness progressed, she found it confusing. Her initial solution was to wear ear plugs to deaden the noise. But this meant she couldn't hear traffic. So she moved to a small village!

Her excellent account of her move is packed with information of how people suffering from dementia perceive their surroundings. It is full of ideas of how to put strategies in place to limit the sufferer's confusion. One practical hint was that everything in the home should be kept in a set place and visible whenever possible.

Our family's dementia journey ended shortly after I finished reading this, her first, book so I haven't read any of her other books. But I very strongly recommend reading "Someone I used to be." The insights in the book would have helped me understand the condition and I could have put into place strategies which would have helped our relatives.
