Welcome to the December/January edition of LINK



Here we are at the close of the year. It's dark and wet outside, so it's time for us to make our own warmth and light. I hope your wood stores are stocked; one silver-lining, perhaps, of the recent storms is the extra supply of firewood some of us may have been able to acquire. I'm extremely grateful to everyone who helped clear the debris up at Tiptoe and I do hope they were all able to take some benefit of their labours home with them.

It strikes me that our annual journey through a season that lacks the warmth and light we long for gives us a practical exercise in patient hope. Just as summer turns to winter, we do not despair, for we know winter will soon turn to spring.

Throughout the scriptures we find examples when people who trusted God had to follow Him through times when His presence and blessing seemed far off. We can think of Noah in his ark on the stormy waters, or the nation of Israel exiled and scattered amongst foreign empires. In each case God gave his people a concrete hope to hold on to:

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned ... For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:2,6)

Christians celebrate the arrival of God's Son into the world in the darkest season of the year, recognizing the light that dawns in darkness. But just as dawn only foreshadows the full warmth of the midday sun, so Christ's birth is only the announcement, the beginning of hope's fulfilment. For Christians the true light of Christmas is the anticipation it brings of Easter joy when the darkness of sin would be defeated on the cross.

So as we celebrate Christmas this year, let's do so as those with a real hope: because Christ came, and died, and rose, we know the darkness will pass, light and joy will come.

Have a very merry Christmas everyone!

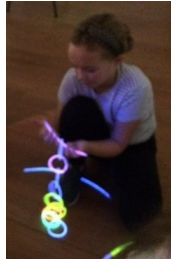

Light Party

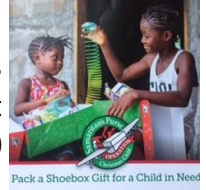

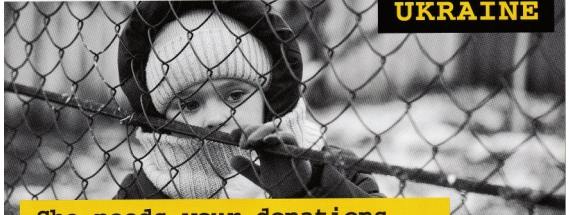
A good crowd then walked to the War Memorial for a service of Remembrance.

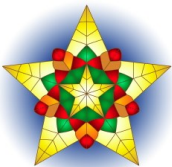


Hordle Advent Windows

They're not religious now, you know!

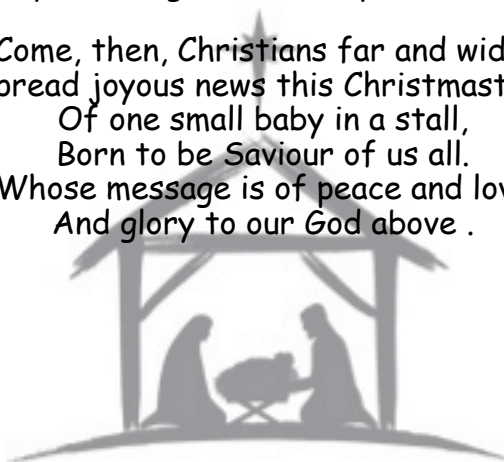


Whatever's happened to Christmas?

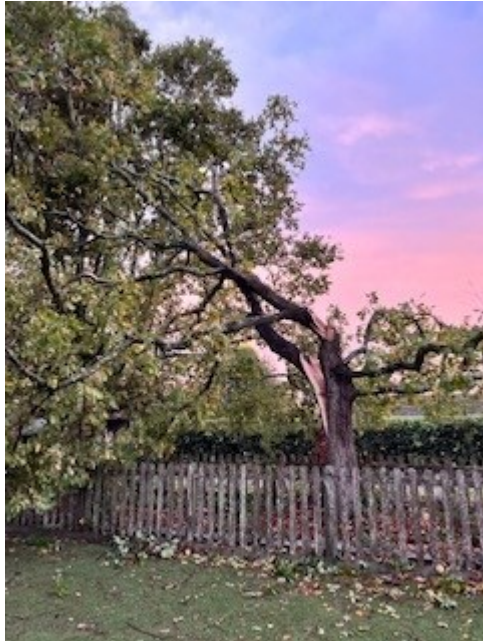

Eco Tip for a **GREENER** Christmas

This Christmas, rather than 'stuff', why not give experiences – a ticket to the cinema, an exhibition, a concert, or tea out together – the offer of an hour's work in the garden, or some decorating ...



Tiptoe Tornado



On 23rd October Tiptoe's tornado left its mark on and around St Andrew's. Mercifully no-one was hurt, the windows all remained intact and the buildings are still watertight. Many of the trees took a beating and two split vertically. Flying debris impacted the rooves, shaving off part of the crest from the church and smashing small indents hither and thither. Boundary fencing and the memorial wooden gazebo also suffered.

Staff and friends of the Butterflies pre-school did an amazing job tidying around the hall, sourcing and building a replacement shed (for the one that flew into the road) and rebuilding fences. A highly skilled tree surgeon required two and a half days to make the trees safe and clear the debris at a cost of £1850. The first roof quote offered so far stands at £3600 and then there will be fence repairs once trees outside St Andrew's grounds have been sorted.

So, a quite extraordinary event producing extra work with significant costs. However, let's be grateful that it was not much, much worse.



HORDLE EXPLORERS NURSERY

Team WILD and Team NEST have been very busy so far this term and we are excited to share some of our highlights

Team Wild have been enjoying learning all about the autumn season this half term. They have been colour experts and have used leaves from their leaf hunts as inspiration for lots of different artwork including leaf rubbings, paintings and printing. The children have created some fabulous culinary dishes in the mud kitchen using orange skins, carrots and pumpkins. They have explored pattern and maths using conkers and acorns and have been very busy at the pumpkin spice play dough station. The children are getting stronger everyday as they use their gross motor skills to explore the Wild garden, using rakes for gathering the fallen leaves and wheelbarrows to transport them. Their hands and fingers are getting stronger too, and they have been completing lots of fine motor activities to help with this including threading autumn beads onto a treat and using tongs and tweezers to pick up conkers and acorns. We have shared some wonderful autumnal stories and the children have been great at retelling the



the Gruffalo story at the story crate and learning new words with Concept Cap. Well done to all of our Team Wild children for their continued enthusiasm, curiosity and for loving their learning despite the very rainy weather and muddy garden!

Team Nest children have had a super time taking part in lots of activities based around "What's Spot?". The children have painted and decorated animal masks, made an obstacle course and practiced their balancing, climbing and sliding. They even made a sticky swap for our toy crocodile and took part in a spot of ballet!

The team have been talking lots about colours and feelings and made different 'feelings faces' in mirrors. The children are enjoying our outdoor classroom and are especially excited to have a new mud kitchen!

The purple sprouting was flat but now I have restaked it; it continues to grow.

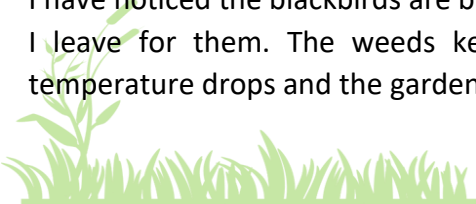

The hedgehog has been rehomed, but it should be in hibernation by now I think, as should the bat.

I have noticed the blackbirds are back enjoying the small Bramley apples which I leave for them. The weeds keep growing so I shall be glad when the temperature drops and the garden can finally be put to bed for the winter!

Small Wonders

This exhibition at St Barbe's in Lymington is a gem not to be missed! Take family members, meet a friend, but GO, and soon because it ends after Christmas! Very suitable for children/grandchildren who will see and read about so much to interest and excite them.

Small Wonders celebrates rather overlooked plants, animals and habitats which are remarkable in their own way and most likely under threat. It is based around the work of contemporary artists, drawing attention to the less acclaimed natural world. This exhibition is a reminder of the richness of British wildlife, while highlighting the precarious situation in which they and many species are now found.

Our own personal 'wonders' were Julie Mannings' exploration of the mind-boggling lives of eels! She paints their mysterious lifecycle in a line up of paintings that is sheer genius and left us delighting in God's design for these creatures. There are beautiful minimalist bronzes of smaller British birds by Geoffrey Dashwood. These contrast with the sculptures of insects made of scrap and old tools by Harriet Mead.



There is so much more ... come and tell us what you loved about your visit.

Although these are desperate times for many British species facing the pressures of climate change, there is good news from rewilding projects big and small, like our own Church meadows, where the decline in populations can be reversed and habitats restored.



Our God has created such fascinating, extraordinary and beautiful organisms.
