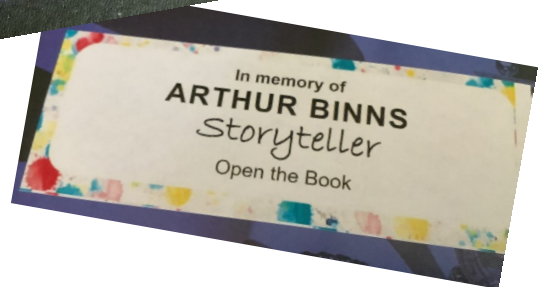


Open the Book -Tiptoe School

AGAIN

A young child soon learns what is pleasing to him or her. When they like something done or read, they will say “again!” ... and not just once!

‘Again’ is a biblical theme. The whole of the Old Testament could be summarised that way. God’s people rebelling, coming back to Him, disobeying further, coming back—and so the cycle goes on. Every time you read one of the narratives about God’s people, you would be forgiven for saying “Again??!!”

Then you get to the New Testament and what happens? God fulfils his promises, again, by showing his love for humankind AGAIN. He sends Jesus to guide and teach first of all.

Then Jesus shows God’s amazing love by going to the cross AND rising (AGAIN) and then God uses the writers of the epistles to teach us further, or AGAIN. Why are we so slow to learn? Perhaps we have a wrong concept of God’s love and grace.

Maybe it's time to get back into our Bibles and read those accounts - AGAIN! You might look at 1 Timothy 1, 15 - 17 as a start.

Lay Ministry Celebration

I can share a secret with you about Bishop David – he is the only bishop who doesn't have a degree in Theology. He shared this during his introduction to the **Diocesan Celebration of Lay Ministry** that Hazel and I recently attended. He was certain that his secret was safe with us! His deeper message was that God is not worried about the church as He is in control.

The event was based on Ezekiel's vision of the dry bones, chapter 37, and contained very positive forward looking thoughts. H Miller, Associate Vicar at St Barnabas, Kensington spoke about his work involving church planting. As Creative Growth Lead for London Diocese H works with the Gregory Centre for Church Multiplication - CCX.org.uk During his presentation he asked us to imagine a large blank sheet of paper on which we drew the outline of our Deanery with no parish boundaries. He then asked us to imagine marking in the churches and then the areas where ministry is most required - social deprivation, youth issues and others. This helped to focus our attention on the real issues.

The afternoon session then centered around various testimonies talking about Youth work, food bank and above all getting people to focus on Jesus and the rest falls into place. We even had a very inspirational short talk on the ministry of the dandelion. It grows where no other plant grows, enriches the soil and brings its own beauty ... but is not always appreciated.

Excited children, and parents, crowded round the plane eagerly waiting the chance to climb into the cockpit and learn more about how it works. Many photos will have been taken. Not often that you have a real aeroplane in your school playground.

Thank you to Kevin, Marc and Nathan for giving Tiptoe School such a wonderful experience – sorry staff that we didn't have time to let you compete on the Flight Simulator – perhaps next time. I can mention however that years five and six said it was great fun.



Next day the plane and team went on to join the Market Day crowds on Lymington High Street demonstrating Jesus' command to love your neighbour in such a very practical way followed by a visit to Lymington Schools.

Thanks to Mary and David for providing last minute 'B n B' for the plane and its trailer. Also gratitude to David for responding to the early morning calls that we had to get the unit to its various 'gigs'.

How thrilled Paddy Armstrong would have been to see this visit come to fruition as it was his inspiration that began our association with Mission Aviation Fellowship.

All Saint's Church Hordle qualified for their Bronze Eco Church Award at the end of 2022. **We have already reported much of this, but here is a precis of the report published in the Diocesan News.**

The Lord asks us to care for Creation. There's so much to learn about *good stewardship*. So, thank you, A Rocha, for the Eco Church survey to help us get started. And thank you, Lord, that we don't do this alone. Our lives are enriched by the loving and prayerful support within our small team.

The parish LINK magazine charts our journey from Tearfund's Clothing Fast, to Repair Cafes, supporting village Litter Picks, a school uniform Clothes Swap, choosing Fairtrade chocolate, celebrating a Greener Christmas and regular Eco tips.



Church members supported Greenpeace's Big Plastic Count last May, posing with Sir Desmond Swayne MP with a week's hard plastic. We were complaining about non-recyclable plastic in our food shopping! Many had never protested before, but we've written to supermarkets, our MP and NFDC about this damaging waste.



Our Parish has two lovely rural churchyards. We now manage sunny areas in these as wildflower meadows to encourage biodiversity. The children helped to site squirrel-proof bird feeders. Brandon Tools in Christchurch offered favourable terms to hire a brush-cutter for a weekend to trim the meadows in September. The cuttings generated spoil heaps to protect hibernating insects through the winter.



Cold weather and soaring energy prices encouraged us to support our community with a Warm Space Café.

This has strengthened links with the village. We are also working more closely with our Parish Council as major housing developments are proposed which will impact the community and the natural environment.

We are blessed to have the support of our incumbent, who is committed to this initiative. He has preached on our Christian responsibility to care for Creation. Following a survey of the congregation, the next BIG challenge for our PCC is heating the buildings sustainably. Expert advice through Parish Buying should help us to do this. The Eco Church framework is helping us to monitor our progress as we, God's worshipping community here, work to live more lightly in his beautiful Creation.

God's New Gen-Z Squad

Recent press coverage, and a sermon from Peter Head at Tiptoe in May, have brought these points to our attention. How many were you aware of?

Gen-Z are those born between mid-1990s and the early 2010s.

A group of students in Wilmore, Kentucky stayed behind after a service one day in February. They felt the unmistakable presence of God. Word spread. For the next two weeks the service did not stop. The New York Times called it 'the nation's first major spiritual revival in decades – one driven by Gen-Z'

Al Gordon, the rector of Saint in East London declared 'It was the real deal.' Another pastor said 'The most significant move of God in our generation has begun, and it's really among Gen-Z'. Al Gordon says 'We've seen so much pain that has been brought to the surface (by COVID) ... people coming along are so open to faith.'

The Church of England has said 'engaging young people is one of its 'top priorities' for the decade.'

Christianity is in decline across the UK, but in London and major cities, more diverse communities, there are growing churches - the 'cool' churches that present an 'acceptable' version of Christianity. These churches are attracting and retaining young people. They have youthful pastors, swish branding and loud music that proves you can be both hip and holy.

Churches need to be wary of placing people in generational boxes, but catering to Gen-Z without alienating older churchgoers can be a challenge.

Holy Trinity Brompton, where Alpha originated, 'planted' 21 new churches across the UK in 2021.

The Daily Telegraph recently posed the question:

'Can the Church bounce back? After all, it's in the business of resurrection.'
