WELCOME to the May edition of LINK



I hope there's some rest in store for you in this month of bank holidays and half-term breaks, as the warmer weather finally starts to take hold (we hope!)

Rest is an extremely important topic in the Bible. The idea of rest appears literally hundreds of times in the Bible - from the opening pages of Genesis, where God himself rests after six days of creative activity, to the principle of weekly rest contained within the ten commandments, or the way God promises to provide his people a land in which they may rest.

The story of the Old Testament is in many ways the tale of a people who long to rest in the blessing of God's presence, but who struggle to achieve this. So often they get in their own way. God promises the Israelites in the wilderness they can collect food on 6 days and they will have enough for seven, but they cannot quite bring themselves to trust God's provision, so they hoard over the first six days. Later in their history they can't help but set up trade on their day of Sabbath rest, foregoing God's provision in order to try and secure their own.

We can do the same. We need more than what we have so we wear ourselves out planning great excursions and exciting experiences, we miss the relationships that would deepen if we gave ourselves more space to spend time together, and so on; God's way is always the best way, but we always tend to think we know better.

Jesus invited: *"Come to me all you weary and heavy laden, and I will give you rest"*. Why not take a break today and spend it praying that Jesus would bless you with rest in his presence this month?

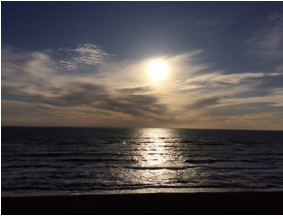
EASTER AT TIPTOE SCHOOL

It would have been very easy to panic about the situation or be angry that it happened but I felt very calm. I did wonder why God had allowed this to happen as I knew it would mean others having to take over my responsibilities and I was going to have to rely on others for help for a long time. So I am hugely grateful to those who have covered for me and helped in so many ways and for all who have prayed and sent cards and messages of love and best wishes.

Many thoughts and verses have helped and I hope they will bring some comfort and help to those who are struggling.

God knows all about our situation and He cares about us and is in control.

When life's afflictions batter you
Like waves upon the sand
Remember to look up to God
And take His outstretched hand.

We experience peace ... not panic ... when we trust the power of God.

When you grow weak in your struggle

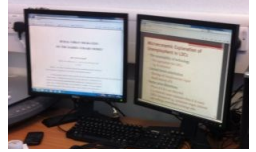

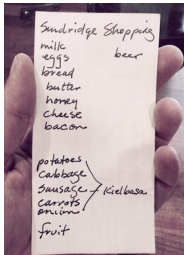
Prayer of Approach

MAF Prayer Requests

MAF Staff and Volunteers regularly receive a prayer support request email. It gives a very broad indication of some of the needs of the organisation.

These are just a few of the recent requests:



Praise God

- that twenty local leaders of the Waodani people in Equador were equipped with the film of Jesus' life on tablets in the local language, so they can now show this in villages
- for a new pilot joining the MAF South Africa team.

Give thanks for

- MAF partner Church Sports and Recreation Ministries (CSR) who brought sports and the gospel to isolated communities in Madagascar.
- MAF flights that provide access to healthcare workers and bring medical supplies to isolated communities
- a recent eye camp in Yuai, South Sudan recently which restored the sight of over 1,250 eyes. The team will fly with MAF to Ayod again soon.
- a recent MAF flight to Kamboe, Kenya where a team from Water Matters delivered water filters.
- a flight carrying a team from the Fred Hollows Foundation in Kenya who performed 250 sight-restoring surgeries.
- a growing workforce, meeting aviation training needs in South-East Asia.
- a recent flight from South Sudan with organisation ACROSS who are providing services to refugee camps in northern Uganda

Pray for

- more teachers to join MAF to teach the children of MAF missionaries
- the economic situation in South Sudan, where their Pound has depreciated a lot in the last six months, leading to an increase in commodity prices. Pray for wisdom for the leaders of the country.
- Papua New Guinea where civil unrest and spiralling fuel costs prompted this prayer plea: that we will find a cost-effective fuel supplier so that flying at full capacity can resume; that the remote communities which rely on us won't be too negatively impacted by the current reduction in MAF flights; that political instability and riots will cease and the country experience peace.

There was one a few weeks ago asking for prayer that a community in Tanzania would remember to cut the grass on their airstrip as it was preventing landings – Mark, can you spare an hour or two?

Dave and Becky Waterman are our linked missionaries serving with MAF in Liberia. Their Spring newsletter opens our eyes to some of the problems they face ...



THE TRIALS OF LIFE IN LIBERIA

We have always tried hard to share honestly about our life on the mission field, but it can be tempting to sweep some of the harder bits under the rug. We love to share the positive impact stories, the amazing moments, even the funny stories of doing life cross-culturally, and all the weird and wonderful misunderstandings that can bring.

But honestly? Life has felt like an uphill struggle in the last couple of months, and we are finding things very difficult. MAF is aware, and supporting us in it all, but it's your continued prayers that have kept us on our feet, and we are so thankful for your support.

Dave and Becky highlight these problems:

- February was intensely hot and humid
- Dave is now the only engineer in Liberia, looking after three planes, and fulfilling other roles within MAF
- Corrosion is a never-ending battle for planes and cars. Running a car is costly.
- Finding fresh fruit and vegetables is a real challenge. It is hard to eat healthily.

But they are also giving thanks:

Despite the challenges, we are so thankful for the blessings we see everyday - from homemade ice cream, to papaya from the garden, to the most beautiful sunsets. We are still smiling, and seeing God's goodness through each and every hardship.

We need to keep praying for them!

This month Kate Pryde looks at
verse five of this Psalm ...

*You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies;
You anoint my head with oil and my cup overflows.*

This is an overwhelming picture of God's enormous generosity. Food and drink that will satisfy despite the presence of those who would deny that to us.

Perhaps you were asked to lay the table for a meal when you were a child. I would always agree but the initial request would always be followed later by a demand that I get my nose out of the book I was reading and get it done before dinner was on the table. Were you the same?

The picture in this verse is of an honoured guest and when we think that it is God who is treating us in that way, then we know God's love for us is making us a very special guest at his feast. Surely then we should be prepared to share God's love and generosity with all whom we meet. Even those for whom we have no great liking?

We may be reminded also of Jesus in the Pharisee's house having been invited to eat and the anointing of his feet by the woman (Luke 7:36ff). There is a pointed contrast between the welcome Jesus had received from Simon and the welcome the woman gave him, kissing His feet and wiping them with her hair. In her great love her sins are forgiven. In Jesus' terms a mean response calls forth less forgiveness.

Truly our cup overflows when we think of God's generosity to us in the giving of himself in the person of his Son to be our Saviour.

THOUGHTS FROM MY GARDEN ...



We have been back to the Hawk Conservancy Trust to watch the owls flying by night. It was a perfect evening, clear with a full moon, but cold. I was glad of the extra layers I was wearing! It was good to see them navigate through the trees although, of course, it was not easy to see everything. We then moved to a more open area, where the snowy owl made her last appearance until next October. She spends the summer in the coolest part of the grounds with her large water bowl filled with ice where she sits to keep cool!

The smaller birds at home have been entertaining me. The robin now comes down when I am gardening to help himself to any worms he fancies, the smaller ones, which he sometimes eats and sometimes flies away with to feed his young. He will come indoors as I leave porridge oats on the floor for him to eat. I know when he has been in because as he flies out, the remaining oats get scattered!

There is also a cock pheasant which feeds under the bird feeders, but when he sees me, he comes running over for more seed. He will come to about two or three feet away from me and sometimes I look up to find him in front of me with an expression which says, "Where is the seed then?" Naturally, I have to stop whatever I am doing to get some seed! It is such a privilege to see these birds so close and to be able to see their feathers, especially the pheasant.

The vegetable garden is a bit behind this year, I am slowly getting the more hardy things in, like the shallots and broad beans. The ground seems to have a crust on it, no doubt through the constant pounding of the rain. I do have seeds in the greenhouse growing on, so I am getting the soil ready and the canes up for the runner beans. The garden is quite pretty at the moment. I have lots of bluebells, unfortunately not the English ones. The grass is growing well, but the earth is still wet underneath; I can see I shall have to strimmer it!

Looking forward to some consistent warmer weather!

May Bee it's time to review what we grow?

A shocking statistic - In less than a 100 years, the UK has lost 97% of wildflower meadows providing vital food for pollinating insects.

Farmers depend on these insects to grow our food. We can help to increase their numbers in our own gardens:

- 1. No Mow May: give your mower a holiday!** Let clover and daisies grow, dandelions too, superfoods for bees and butterflies. Less mowing boosts the pollen count in our lawns. If leaving the whole lawn is *too radical*, leave a few square metres, and enjoy observing the wildlife activity.
- 2. Best for insects are traditional cottage garden plants** - primroses, hollyhocks, crocosmia, day lilies, lavender, echinacea, verbena, honeysuckle, and ivy (which grows and seeds into winter). Aim to **choose plants with open blooms** where the nectar and pollen are easy to access and avoid tight multi-petalled flowers. **Aim for pollen and nectar for as much of the year as possible.**
- 3. Avoid chemicals** in the garden - they kill insects.
- 4. Provide a water feature** ... as simple as an upturned dustbin lid with fresh, clean water. Insects and birds will love it - and no worries about children falling in!

Hordle is twinned with the French village of Yerville, and this year’s Olympics are being held in Paris. So, our theme for the 2024 Scarecrow Competition is **“The Paris Olympics”** Scarecrows can be either of a sporting or Parisian design. This is the Bradley Wiggins scarecrow from the 2012 Olympics!



Entry forms will be available from local shops in late May and scarecrows to be on display in July. The trail and judging will take place during the school summer holidays and voting slips counted at the Hordle Summer Fair on 31st August. More information will be displayed around the village.
