Just after the announcement from the Diocese of the appointment of the new Bishop of Winchester in July, the Bishop designate issued a letter to the Diocese. We print an abbreviated version here.

Dear brothers and sisters,

It's a pleasure and privilege to send you these few words, now that it is known that I am to be your next Diocesan Bishop. What I want to do is to give you a flavour of what I pray for in all that lies ahead.



*'And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.
But the greatest of these is love' (1 Cor 13.13)*

It is on these three, above all else - on faith, on hope and on love – that I want my ministry, and our life together in the Diocese of Winchester, to be based.

In line of sight above my desk I have a little piece of paper stuck on the wall that says this:

*'Don't feel totally, personally, irrevocably responsible for everything.
That's my job. Love, God.'*

I know that I cannot do my job unless I depend wholly on our God. We must be people of faith.

We should be - and we must be - a truly hopeful people, simply because Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. I have an evangelical heart for the gospel and a Catholic heart for the Church, and I love to lead it onwards in hope.

Finally, of course, to love. Love must be the hallmark of all we do, for without it we are worth nothing. It's my great joy to be called to come and lead you in that great work of love.

Bible Society at RHS Tatton Flower Show

The RHS Tatton Flower Show in Cheshire is one of the highlights of a garden-lover's calendar, and features beautiful gardens by leading designers. **This year one of them, based on Psalm 27, was sponsored by Bible Society** – and its designer Ollie Pike won a silver medal for its creation.

The garden was inspired by the graveyards Ollie used to visit during lockdown, which he found to be calming and welcoming spaces where he could reconnect with nature. [Psalm 27](#), which begins *'The Lord is my light and my salvation'*, spoke to him of God's protection in the face of challenging circumstances, and of the eternal hope found in him. Stone markers and a tomb-like structure speak of our mortality, but there's also the sense of a journey through grief to hope. The planting evokes a meadow, with soft grasses and wildlife-friendly flowering plants.

Bible Society's CEO Paul Williams said, 'We're really proud to bring this garden to Tatton Park. Psalm 27 deals with issues of fear, loss and hope which are still so relevant to us today. So, we hope it's a reminder and an invitation to go back to something foundational, spiritual and beautiful in our lives.'

After the show, the garden will be reconstructed in Sheffield General Cemetery.

In August, media reports highlighted a 'surge' in leprosy cases in the USA, particularly in Florida.

We welcome stories of leprosy in the press as they raise awareness of leprosy as a 21st century disease. But it is equally important to realise that it is not a disease to be feared.

Leprosy has been easily curable since the 1980's with Multidrug therapy. It is a disease of poverty, thriving in communities where there is malnutrition, overcrowding and poor sanitation. Yet it is only mildly infectious, and more than 95 per cent of people are immune to the disease. That is why there have been no indigenous cases of leprosy in the UK since 1798.

To put the US figures into context, there were 159 new leprosy cases diagnosed in the US in 2020. In contrast 65,147 new cases were found in India in the same year.

PCC Jottings - August 2023



At the APCM Clive Gammon was elected to PCC and June Bailey to Deanery Synod.

Following unsuccessful interviews for a Children's/Youth worker there were two more enquiries which led to further interviews and one of these applicants has been appointed. The safer recruitment process has begun but it will be a while before everything is in place. Rental accommodation will be required. In the meantime the PCC agreed to the Youth Club 'Rooted' being started in April. Each monthly meeting has been fully booked with children from years 5 and 6.

A new advert for an Associate Minister has been posted, with a closing date at the end of September.

Following the Vision Day in June 2022 another one has been arranged for September. Serious forward planning is on the agenda so we can improve our resources to carry forward each element of our Vision statement.

An extra PCC was held to discuss the PCC/Church response to the Prayers of Blessing for same sex marriages proposed by General Synod. As an outcome of that meeting the PCC is participating in the Living in Love and Faith course that was the consultation document prior to the Synod's decision.

Accommodation is being sought for a church weekend away next year but so far it has not been possible to find anywhere suitable that can accommodate all preferences.

All Saints' have been awarded the Eco church Bronze award. Well done to the team! An energy audit is being carried out as part of the next stage.

Reviewing of safeguarding policies takes place regularly. An administrative review has been carried out, with results due in September. It was agreed to keep the All Saints' service times the same after the six month trial.

Following a new application for development on Hordle Lane, a letter of concern has been sent to the planning department stating our concerns over parking and extra traffic outside All Saints' Church and Hordle School.

Wow! What a wonderful time members of both churches had together following the morning services.

The weather was fortunately sunny and bright, but not quite settled or warm enough to be outside.


Thank you for your warm welcome; thank you for the care you showed to our family; and thank you for your faithfulness in the Gospel.

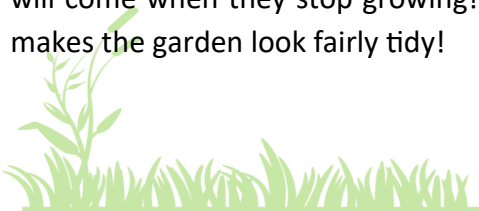


Robin is still coming in two or three times a day to feed. I went out of the back door, came back in and locked the door only to find him inside! One day, I am sure I will lock him in.

AT HOME: Practical tips to help the environment



Earlier this year, All Saints Church surveyed the congregation about the Climate Crisis. Here are suggestions from individuals already acting to reduce their impact on our beautiful planet. Each change is relatively small, but the effects are cumulative. What will you action this Autumn?

1. Join with neighbours to **RECYCLE** soft plastic, tetrapaks and bottle tops at local recycling points.
2. **REPURPOSE** vegetable & meat trays as *seed* trays; plastic bread bags to line *waste bins*.
3. Avoid clingfilm and foil. Use greaseproof paper instead.
4. Choose sustainable products e.g. SMOL washing caplets, soap leaves and Fussy deodorant (refillable and compostable!)
5. Only run the washing machine on a full load.
6. Using the oven: cook several things at the same time.
7. **BE AWARE OF FOOD MILES:** read labels and choose local, British, seasonal fruit and vegetables.
8. Choose **FAIRTRADE** tea, coffee, chocolate, and sugar if you can afford them.
9. **SHOP FOR 2ND HAND** clothing, furniture and household goods where possible.

10. Try to **REDUCE** your water usage.
11. Investigate solar panels, heat pumps and electric cars.
12. **REPLACE** old light bulbs with LEDs.

Let's also **pray constantly** for God's wisdom for ourselves, and for leaders everywhere to invest resources well for our shared future.
