### Searchlight Theatre Company



# 'We'll listen to the Bible as we garden'

An elderly couple in a village just north of Kharkiv were delighted to receive an audio Bible recently. 'We'll listen to the Bible as we work in our vegetable garden preparing for winter,' they said.

It is common in villages across Ukraine to grow your own food, and summer and autumn are the busiest times. But in the villages of Bobrivka and Barak, near Kharkiv, farmers and growers face extra threats.

The whole area is now full of landmines and unexploded shells. Some 350 cows have escaped from their farm, but can't be rounded up because of the landmines. So they are eating the crops that people are trying to grow to keep them alive over the winter.

And as they work on the land, they come under regular artillery attack and are frequently shelled.

Local chaplain Oleksandr had given a couple a Bible earlier in the war. 'We read it a lot, and it has helped us to withstand recent trials,' they said. But the audio Bible now means that they can listen to the word of God while growing their crops, in the most dangerous of conditions.

Oleksandr said that he hoped that gifts of Bibles and audio Bibles to these villages would help people who 'feel frightened and abandoned' to find hope.

Some weeks ago, on MAF Sunday, both churches were introduced to Dave and Becky Waterman by means of a video. They are our Link Missionaries. The latest newsletter on their website tells of this recent experience!

# Major Surgery in Monrovia

'There are certain things you expect when moving to a developing nation. Frequent power and water outages (we've had our share of those in the last few months), feeling far from friends and family, dealing with tropical diseases like malaria and typhoid...

What you don't necessarily prepare for is waking up on a normal day and needing to rush to a mission hospital for major surgery.

The 2nd of June started like any other day. Our alarm sounded at 5:50am and we got up, Dave got changed for work and we sat down to breakfast. Suddenly, Dave felt a pain on the right hand side of his abdomen. Within half an hour it was excruciating, and we drove the mercifully short journey to ELWA hospital, on the other side of the compound we live on. He was diagnosed with acute appendicitis. Within an hour and a half he was in surgery, having his appendix removed.

The situation we found ourselves in was far from ideal, but we were amazed at the provision and care we received. From a friend who is a nurse at the hospital not resting until she'd called every surgeon to get one there, to a private room for Dave to recover in, to power which stayed on consistently for the whole duration of his stay, allowing air conditioning ... every detail worked out better than we could have hoped. God is good!

Dave is back at home now, and recovering from his experience! He'll have a good scar as a souvenir from his stay in hospital, and it'll be a few weeks until he's back up to full strength.'

My daughter from the Lake District has been staying, with her dog, which kept the deer away. As soon as she left, the deer returned! He had a quick feed of the beetroot and chard. Fortunately we woke up and he left over the small gate which opens onto the road! The garden now is a bit like Fort Knox, the small gate now has an extension - hopefully we have done enough to keep him out!

My vegetable garden is not very good this year, mostly because of the lack of rain. The chard will recover as it is a "pick and come again" plant, and the winter greens should give us a supply. The courgettes have produced enough fruit but the leaves are getting brown from the heat. When I see cabbage white butterflies, I throw water at them and they quickly disappear!

The wild blackberries are ripening well, I have started picking them to put in the freezer. At least there are plenty for me, the birds and anything else. I have had a dog who would carefully pick them to eat but the ponies prefer someone to pick and feed them. You have to watch out or you will find a pony helping themselves to the ones you have picked!



I shall be glad when it cools a little, but I do enjoy the early morning trips to Hordle Cliff beach for my daughter to swim. We were up at 5.30am this morning to catch the low tide; people were already in the water when we arrived! I only paddle although I am tempted to sit at the edge of the water. This morning, the moon was setting and the sun was not yet up; it was very pleasant.

Looking forward to rain!

# The Yearly Miracle

# Keep an eye out for the Asian hornet

The invasive **Asian hornet** is a serious threat to the UK's wildlife, especially our native honeybees. They impact the pollination of plants and crops. So far it is believed they are not present in the UK, but it is very likely we will find them arriving soon.

They have been spotted on the Channel Islands, and in 2016 in Tetbury, Gloucestershire a large nest was destroyed. It is vital for everyone to be on the lookout and report sightings straight away, they will be acted on.

#### Asian hornets are a serious threat to our honeybees.

Defra has produced **a national pollinator strategy (2014)** to highlight the threat Asian hornets pose to bees. European honeybees have no defensive strategies to fight back. At the Brockenhurst Eco Fair I talked with beekeepers who spoke of the danger these non-native invasive predators could be to the UK honey bee population. It is possible our coastal New Forest is where they could turn up and they urged me to:

- $\cdot$   $\,$  be able to differentiate the European Hornet from the Asian Hornet
- Load 'Asian Hornet Watch' App on my mobile phone, or report online. Any suspicion is worth reporting we need to protect our wildlife.
- Keep vigilant when walking in the New Forest and especially if near any bee hives
- To share with others about this threat.

## What does it look like?

#### European hornet (Vespa crabro)

- Larger than Asian hornets
- Head yellow from front and red from above
- · Abdomen mostly pale yellow with black stripes
- Thorax and legs black/ reddish brown

The European Hornet is no problem to our bees and does not need reporting.

#### Asian hornet (Vespa velutina)

- · Smaller than native hornets
- Orange head (from front)
- Abdomen almost entirely dark, with fine yellow stripes and a yellow or orange 4th segment near the base
- · Black or brown thorax
- Legs with yellow tips


